This past year, and for over a decade, you—our wonderful fundholders, donors and community members—continue to astonish us with your deep commitment to philanthropy in a way that is empathetic, innovative and strategic. Over the past twelve months, you helped us reach so many exceptional achievements and milestones, including now housing over 150 funds, reflecting the Arab American community’s growing commitment to strategic giving, and for that we are incredibly grateful.

2021 was monumental in reinforcing the Center for Arab American Philanthropy’s (CAAP) local, national and even international reach and just how impactful we can be when we **give smart and give together**. Your support helped us grant more than \$1.6 million in fiscal year 2021 to causes around the world, including awarding nearly \$200,000 in scholarships to 80 ambitious students nationwide. Further, through our board-directed competitive grantmaking programs, we impacted 25 nonprofit organizations around the country with more than \$150,000 in grants. Due to the continuing dire needs in Lebanon, several impact area funds housed at CAAP granted more than \$374,000 to charitable organizations providing essential on-the-ground humanitarian aid. Additionally, thanks to the improved public health conditions this year, we also had the privilege of gathering in Cleveland, Ohio for our third annual *Threads of Giving Gala* to honor local and international philanthropist Bushra Rahim with the *Outstanding Arab American Philanthropist of the Year Award*.

This year reminded us that philanthropy is a communal experience where we pool our love for humanity to collectively make a difference. When we give strategically as a community, we achieve something incredible: an unbreakable and impactful force of Arab American giving that is paving the way for a brighter future. Let’s keep growing this force, hand-in-hand.

CAAP touches the lives of millions across the nation and around the world

CAAP aims to transform lives by empowering Arab Americans to make an impact on the causes they care about, while uplifting communities across the world. Our CAAP donors and fundholders know no borders when it comes to where they want to invest their time, talent and treasure, securing CAAP’s global role in connecting Arab American donors to meaningful giving opportunities that create transformational change.



CAAP and the National Network for Arab American Communities (NNAAC) granted a combined total of **\$130,000** to **19** Arab American nonprofit organizations across the U.S. focusing on human services and arts and culture



Students in our Teen Grantmaking Initiative (TGI) learned the invaluable skill of grantmaking and leadership development through real-life application, awarding grants to Detroit Heals Detroit, Congress of Communities and the American Association of Yemeni Students and Professionals



CAAP awarded **320** grants totaling **\$1,614,911** to causes around the world

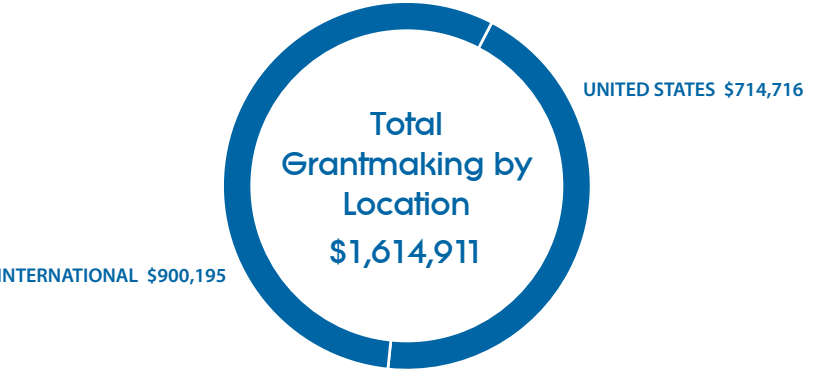
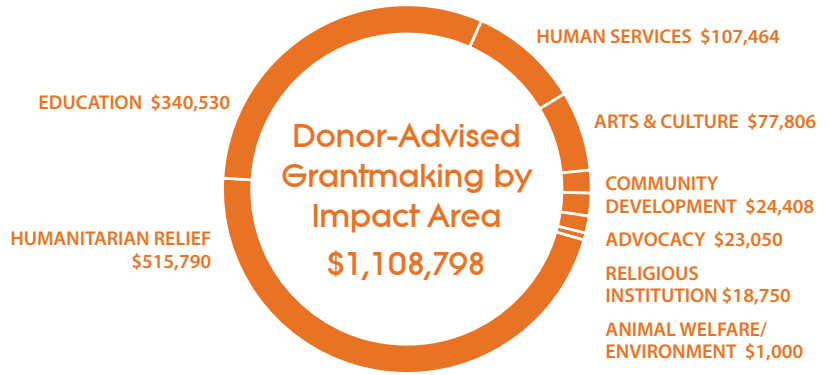
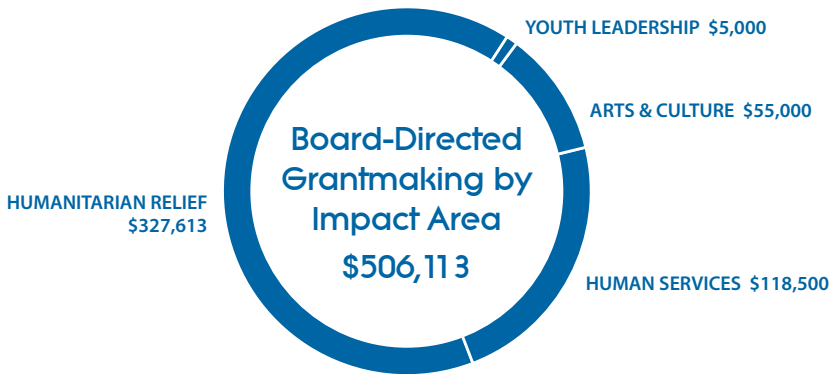

CAAP Honors Local and International Philanthropist Bushra Rahim at annual *Threads of Giving Gala*

Arab Americans’ vibrant history of giving is not always remembered and uplifted, which is why—as the nation’s only Arab American community foundation—we have a responsibility to amplify our community’s longstanding contributions. The *Outstanding Arab American Philanthropist of the Year Award* recognizes one Arab American each year for being trailblazers of giving in their communities. This year, we had the honor of awarding local and international philanthropist Bushra Rahim at our annual *Threads of Giving Gala* in the very special city of Cleveland, Ohio. Over 200 individuals from across the country gathered to honor Bushra’s many years of uplifting underserved refugees and cancer patients. At this powerful event, we also enjoyed one-of-a-kind musical entertainment by Simon Shaheen and his brilliant ensemble as well as honorary guest vocalist Nina Boutros El-Hayek.



Born and raised in Baghdad, Iraq, Bushra beautifully merges the values of her Iraqi heritage and family traditions, as well as her talent as a luxury home designer, in her personal approach to philanthropy. Bushra’s contributions are felt globally, but especially in Cleveland, where she has been empowering Arab refugees for over 50 years. Her love for her community has also inspired her to dedicate her time and treasure to showcasing her culture through her involvement in organizations, such as the Cleveland Council on World Affairs, and by establishing an enriching Arabic language program for youth. Additionally, in memory of her mother Khadija and as a survivor herself, Bushra channels her resources towards cancer research and treatment at the American Cancer Society and the King Hussein Cancer Center in Amman, Jordan.

It was truly a privilege to recognize such an incredible woman, who sets an exceptional example of what it means to give from the heart.



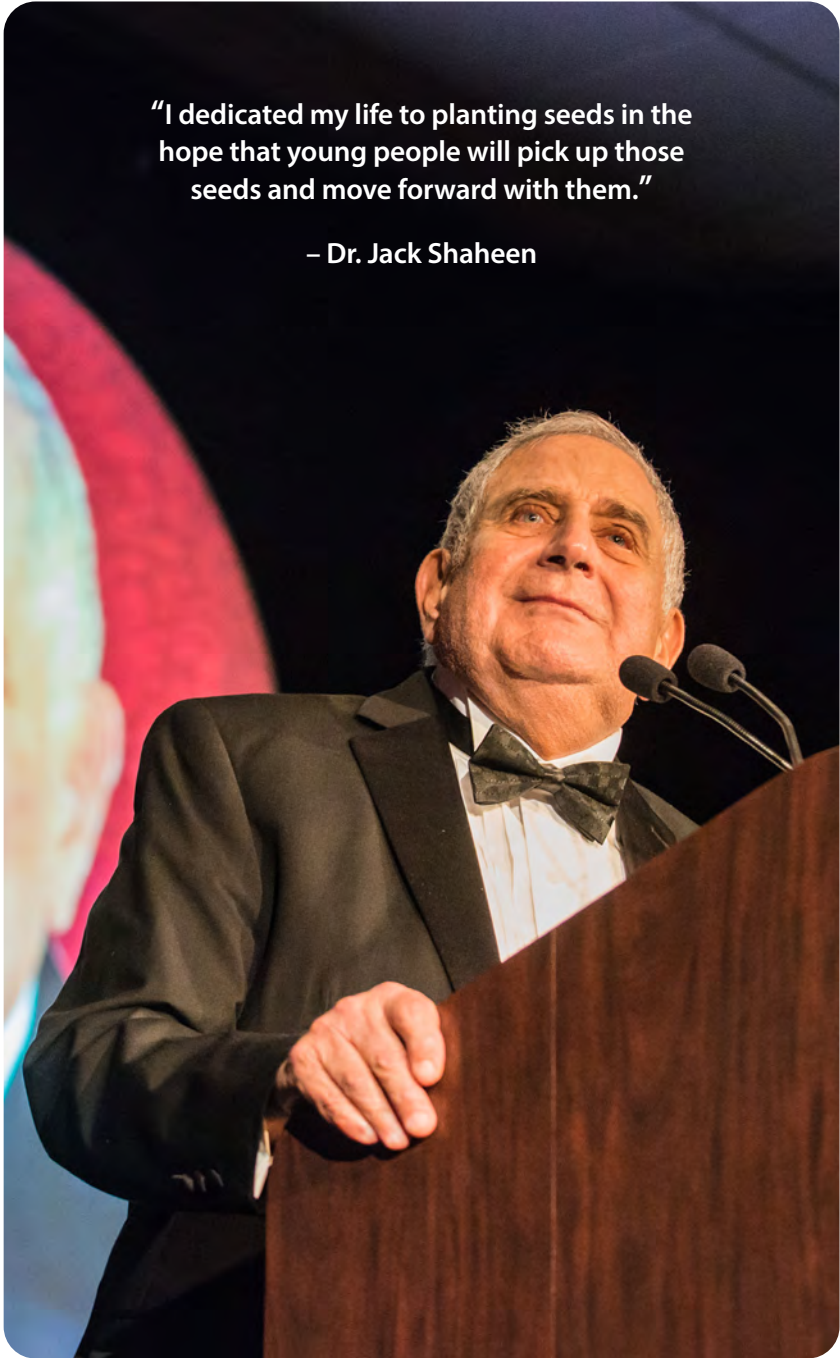
Dr. Jack G. Shaheen’s work and legacy continue to dismantle misconceptions about Arab Americans

An educator, philanthropist and intellectual, the late Dr. Jack Shaheen was the leading voice in combating anti-Arab and anti- Muslim bigotry in the media through works such as his popular book, *Reel Bad Arabs*, his work as a correspondent for CBS News, and his appearances on CNN, MSNBC and NPR to discuss Middle Eastern affairs.

The Jack G. & Bernice M. Shaheen Endowed Media Scholarship Fund at CAAP secures the continuous support of increased educational opportunities for energetic Arab American students majoring in mass communications, journalism and film. Since 1997, the Dr. Jack G. Shaheen Scholarships have supported 94 students nationwide who uphold Dr. Shaheen’s commitment to cultivating understanding and fair representation of Arabs and Muslims. Recipients of the scholarship—including filmmaker Annemarie Jacir, NPR correspondent Leila Fadel, local news reporter Joe Khalil and *New York Times* journalist Karen Zraick—have gone on to lead promising careers in media, where they bring Arab American representation to their respective fields.

Over 100 Arab American Women come together to showcase the power of giving together

At the heart of CAAP’s mission is the power of giving together. Our *100 Arab American Women Who Care* event gathers 100, or more, women who pool their dollars into one grant that will support a cause they collectively decide on. This year, attendees of this powerful event made a \$10,000 collective grant to a critical organization: Arbor Hospice, which cares for terminally ill patients by fostering a supportive and peaceful environment for them and their loved ones.



At this year’s event, we also had the privilege of enjoying a fashion show featuring breathtaking designs by highly-acclaimed Birmingham-based boutique *Dolce Moda* and award-winning bridal gown designer Ms. Katerina Bocci.

It was incredibly moving to witness such a dedicated cohort of women showcase their collective generosity at our eighth annual event. Since its inception, the *100 Arab American Women Who Care* event has granted more than \$80,000 to various organizations and causes.

Newly established Account Spark STEM Scholarship aims to serve as pipeline of talent for tech industry

As founders of the successful data analytics company, Account Spark, Mr. Noor Atari and Ms. Areej Bazzari both hold education near and dear to their hearts.

Noor’s family faced displacement in Palestine, moving to Kuwait, where Noor was born. The family was re-confronted with the realities of conflict when the Gulf War erupted, forcing them to start a new life in the United States. These adversities didn’t stop Noor from working hard towards his education and his career. Now the CEO of Account Spark, Noor credits much of his success to the generous contributions of donors who assisted him along his educational journey, inspiring him to pay it forward by assisting the next generation of Arab Americans. This moved the couple to establish the Account Spark STEM Scholarship at CAAP, which supports young Arab American students studying Data Science, Data Analytics or related programs.

In 2021, the Fund awarded its first-ever scholarship to Basmalah Algahmi, who is an outstanding student and campus change-maker at the University of Michigan-Dearborn, where she studies Software Engineering. Her goal is to establish a coding school in Yemen to create opportunities for youth who otherwise would not have access to critical educational programming.
