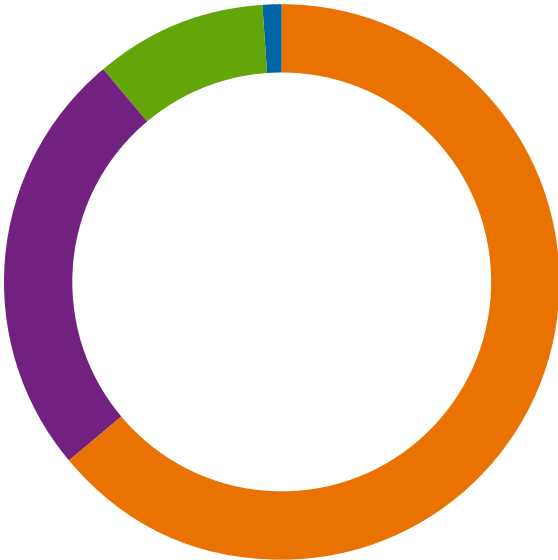

BOARD-DIRECTED GRANTMAKING BY IMPACT AREA

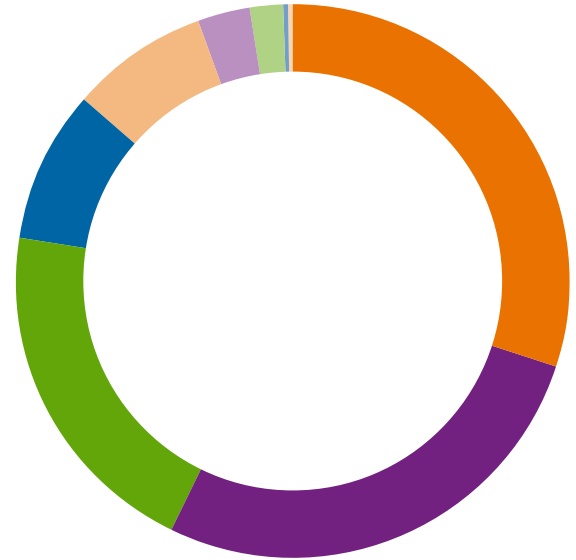

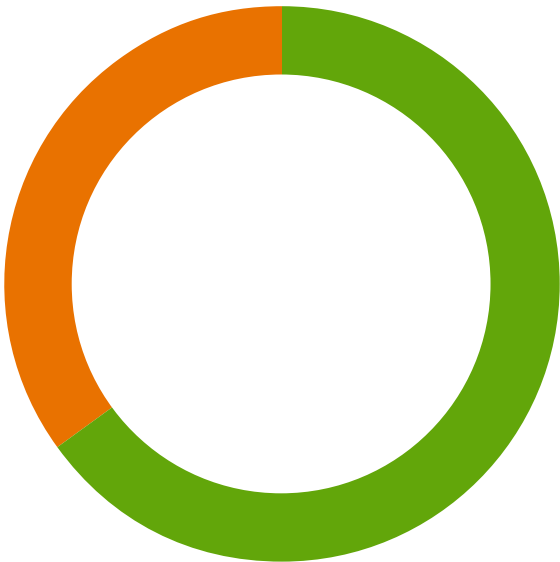

IMPROVING COMMUNITIES



CAAP and the National Network for Arab American Communities (NNAAC) awarded

\$130,000 in general operating support

to Arab American organizations across the country this year, and CAAP also distributed an additional \$25,000 to institutions to provide emergency relief to refugee and immigrant families.



CAAP AWARDED 463 GRANTS TOTALING **\$2,196,998** TO CAUSES AROUND THE WORLD



Through our many scholarship funds, CAAP proudly awarded **over \$210,000 to 90 students across the country** representing various disciplines and career aspirations.

CAAP responded quickly to disasters such as floods in Pakistan and tornadoes in Kentucky through our Disaster Relief Fund, **granting \$23,170 to nonprofits that help affected families.**





WE ARE MORE POWERFUL WHEN WE GIVE **TOGETHER.**

Going into its ninth year, our signature **100 Arab American Women Who Care** giving circle continues to demonstrate the possibilities of collective philanthropy. At our 2022 event, 100 Arab American women each donated \$100, resulting in a \$10,000 grant they collectively voted to give to Muslim Foster Care Association, an organization that champion's the well-being of neglected children through community education, support networks and advocacy.



BREAKING BARRIERS AND UNLEASHING A BETTER FUTURE

Amanda Jaber created the **Education Without Barriers Fund** at CAAP to award scholarships to bright students in the Middle East who have shown exceptional promise despite the obstacles posed by war and occupation. Shurooq Hammad, the fund's first recipient, conquered incredible challenges while living in the West Bank's Kalendiyah refugee camp. Her record of achievement and leadership, combined with scholarship support from this fund at CAAP, enabled her to complete her medical degree at Al-Quds University – Abu Dias Campus, and is now providing critically-needed medical support to her local community.

RECLAIMING AND UPLIFTING OUR ARAB AMERICAN GIVING STORY

Today, Arab American philanthropists are giving back in all areas of

American society while continuing to support communities in need across the world. As Arab Americans reclaim their own narrative about their contributions and impact in this country, no story is complete without uplifting the ways that Arab American philanthropy contributes to improving communities, our country and the world.

In 2022, CAAP released our completed report, *A Tapestry of Giving*, which explores the practices and values of Arab American donors. CAAP is the only organization to conduct research on the philanthropy of Arab Americans. Findings from the report were presented at the Council of Michigan Foundations' 50th Annual Conference.

The results show the nation that Arab American giving is deeply personal and rooted in trust of an institution and its leadership. Our hope, as the nation's only Arab American community foundation, is that *A Tapestry of Giving* will lead to richer conversations about the impact and role of Arab American giving in shaping our society.



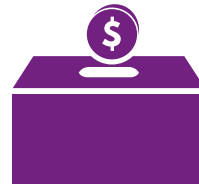

ARAB AMERICAN YOUTH RAISE \$5,000 TO STRENGTHEN THE WORK OF LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS

2022's session of the **Teen Grantmaking Initiative (TGI)** reaffirmed that our youth are capable and eager to make a major impact in their local communities. TGI at the Center for Arab American Philanthropy is an Arab American youth-led philanthropy program that walks youth through the grantmaking process through real-life application. Students come together to research needs in their local community, fundraise money and collectively decide on organizations to support. This year, the Michigan chapter of the TGI program fundraised \$5,000 to be granted to three organizations: Arab Student Union, Detroit Area Youth Uniting Michigan and InsideOut Literary Arts.



MANAR YASEEN HELPS ORGANIZE YOUTH-LED CONFERENCE

TGI executive member Manar Yaseen continues to demonstrate exceptional leadership by organizing the Neutral Zone's Youth-Driven Spaces Conference, bringing together 120 youth and adult allies from southeast Michigan to discuss mental health in education.

TGI member Jenna Mahmoud spoke to her experience as a young Arab American student who is challenging misconceptions about her community in a CBS Reports documentary series. In this episode, Jenna was joined by other teens opening up what belonging and inclusion mean to them.



REPRESENTATION MATTERS!

The **Arab American Leadership Program** (AALP), facilitated by the National Network for Arab American Communities and funded by the Arab American Leadership Fund at CAAP, aims to strengthen the political power of the Arab American community by dismantling barriers to public service positions for ambitious students. This year, this powerful initiative placed five Arab American students in congressional positions, most of whom were working in Washington D.C.



RUSSELL J. EBEID'S LEGACY OF EMPOWERMENT CONTINUES

As a prominent world business leader and passionate philanthropist, the late Russell J. Ebeid dedicated his life to advancing underserved communities forward. This year, the **Ebeid Family Fund Scholarship** program awarded \$82,500 to 32 exemplary students studying engineering or STEM-related fields. In September, CAAP proudly recognized all these students for their academic achievements at a ceremony.
